MALARIA PROPHYLACTIC FOR TRANS AFRICA EXPEDITIONS

We have received a recent directive from the World Health Organisation advising us that our dosage of Fansidar and Nivaquine should not be taken together.

Their suggestion is: -

- 1 Fansidar per week e.g. Sunday
- 2 Nivaquine or 300 mgs per week e.g. Wednesday

The reason for this is, to keep a standard level of prophylactic in your body all the time.

Your E M' s joining in Johannesburg are now being advised to begin their course four weeks prior to departure. This is due to the expedition entering a malarial zone within the first week. (i.e. Botswana and Zambia).

In the case of Brief Encounter in South and East Africa, E M' s are also being advised of the above despite the fact that we do not supply the drugs.

Please do your utmost to ensure that the above is adhered to - malaria is a growing problem in Africa and in Encounter Overland Limited!!
